UW-Richland Collaborative Program with the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture

Overview

Participants in this educational alliance enroll at UW-Richland during their freshman and sophomore years and work toward their Associate of Arts & Science degree. Following successful completion of the AA&S degree, they will apply and be evaluated for admission by officials of the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture. Admission to the program in the junior year is competitive. The Bachelor of Architectural Studies degree prepares students for graduate study in architecture and related fields.

World-renowned architect Frank Lloyd Wright was born in Richland Center, where his 1915 building, the A.D. German Warehouse, is located. Taliesin East in Spring Green was Wright's summer home and the place where he trained apprentice architects beginning in the 1930s. Wright's family and roots are in the southwest region of Wisconsin, a landscape often cited as his inspiration for organic architecture.

About the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture

The Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture is a year-around program with a 12-month calendar. On-campus residency is required. The winter session is at Taliesin West in Scottsdale, Arizona. The summer session is at Taliesin in Spring Green, Wisconsin.

Successful applicants work to earn a Bachelor of Architectural Studies (BAS) degree. The BAS degree is an undergraduate pre-professional degree. Graduates of the program are prepared to enter professional-level graduate schools in architecture and related fields. The Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture also offers a professional Master of Architecture degree. Both degree programs are designed for students who thrive in a multifaceted environment focusing on rigorous design, critical thinking, and hands-on learning
