Please review these general rules with your parents:

- NO RUNNING! No throwing sports equipment unless in a designated area.
- Wear your name badge at all times – every day.
- Do not litter.
- Know where you will be picked up or met at the end of the day.
- If you have asthma and need an inhaler please have it with you at all times.

Attendance

We expect students to attend every day to get the full benefit of the program; however, if for any reason you will be absent, please let the office know in advance at (608) 647-6186 X227. If you are sick, please stay home to avoid spreading illness through the group. (Hand sanitizer will be in each room and hand washing before snacks encouraged.)

Opening Day – Monday July 20

On Monday, July 20, you should arrive at UW-Richland by 12:30. Because you are older students and in most cases alumni of the College for Kids program, you will be allowed to go directly to your first class with the assistance of guides placed on the sidewalks and by using the map on the reverse. Do **NOT** report to the gym! There are no afternoon busses that we are aware of, but to remain consistent with the morning drop offs, we prefer that if you are traveling by car that you are dropped off or park in East Parking lot. Be sure you verify where you will meet after classes with the adult who brought you.

Name tags and T-shirts will be at your first class. Guides near the Wallace Student Center will be carrying class lists in case you forget the names of your courses or which class is first. When you get to your class, please put on your name badge and wear it everyday. You may wear your MSU T-shirt as much as you like, but we ask that you plan to wear it on the last day.

The first class will start right at 12:45 and at 2:15 there will be a break and guides will assist you in finding your second class. At 4 pm you will be done for the day and should proceed to the parking lots to be picked up. (Be sure you know where you will meet your ride after classes.)

Tuesday through Friday

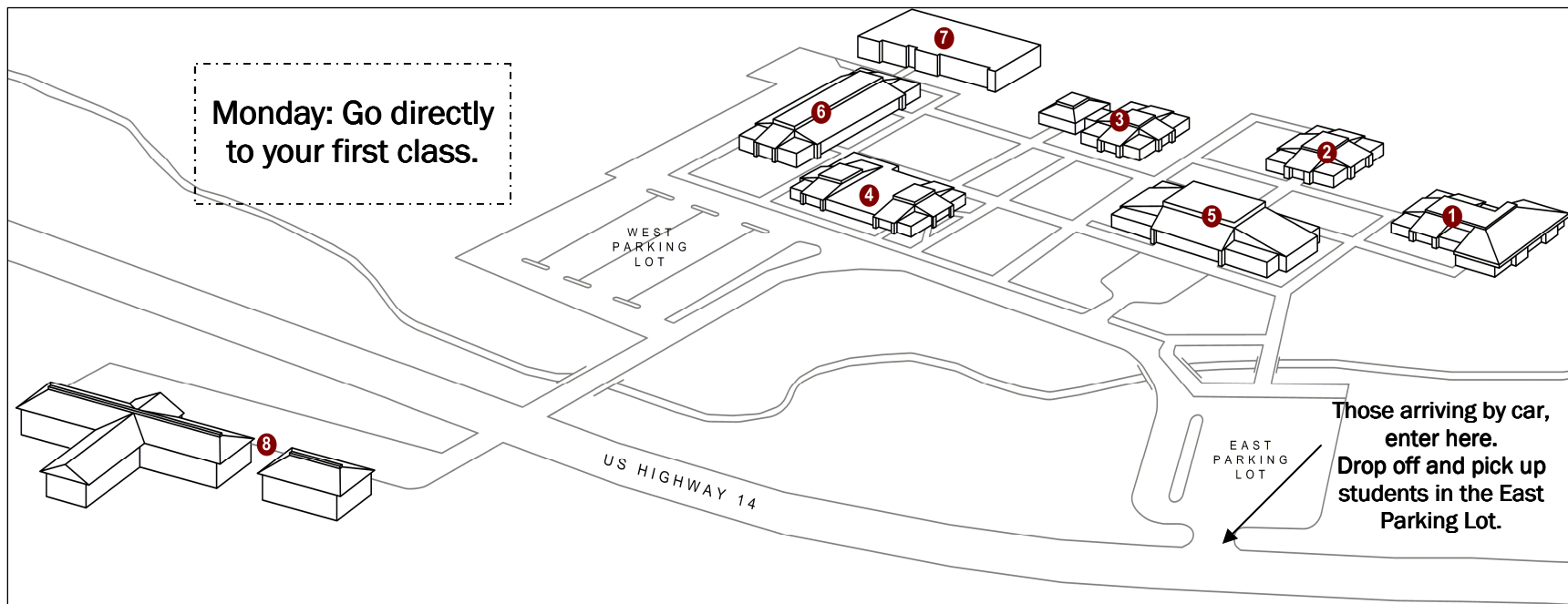
Please arrive by 12:45, but **no earlier than 12:30 unless you are attending either CFK classes or AM Choice or are ordering lunch from the cafeteria** (see lunch offer on reverse with "what to bring" list). Do not enter any buildings (except for using the cafeteria for lunch) until 12:45. After break do not enter buildings until 2:30 so that teachers can have the break period to prepare for their next class.

LUNCH!

If you are attending AM Choice or are enrolled in CFK in the morning - you have two options for lunch (11:45 – 12:45). You can bring your own sack lunch OR take advantage of hot meals cooked in our own Roadrunner Café! Your reservation for meals (all or some) **must be returned with full payment by July 10**. You may also be dropped off early at 11:45 **if you are purchasing lunch at the Roadrunner Café**. When you are done eating lunch 4H/MSU coordinators will organize games for the group.
