

Important

Students who have earned more than 60 credits may not be eligible for continuing student scholarships because most will have completed their AA&S degree at that point. Transferring Student Scholarships are offered through the UW-Richland Scholarship Program.

With the exception of transferring student scholarships, scholarships awarded through the UW-Richland Foundation are intended for use only on the UW-Richland campus.

Notification

New freshmen are generally presented their awards at their spring high school awards ceremonies. Transferring scholarship recipients are presented their awards during the Graduation/Awards Night program in May. Continuing student scholarship recipients are notified by mail and included in public events recognizing their achievements.

Scholarship recipients are expected to participate in a Donor-Recipient Reception held in the fall.

About the UW-Richland Scholarship Program

The Richland County Campus Foundation administers the UW-Richland Scholarship Program which annually awards over \$100,000 to qualified students. Awards are granted to qualified freshman, sophomore & transferring students.

Scholarships recognize academic achievement, the primary criterion upon which selections are based. The Scholarship Committee also looks for well-defined and clear goals.

Please know that your transcripts and GPAs are shared between the UW-Richland and the Richland County Campus Foundation.

Who

Incoming freshmen, continuing students, transferring students, international students, traditional and returning adult students are all welcome to apply. A “B” average is generally the minimum requirement. Scholarship awards for art, music and theatre may be determined by audition or portfolio presentation. Clearly defined goals, rather than past academic performance, will be given consideration when awarding some scholarships for returning adults. Some awards may consider financial need. Eligibility for transfer scholarships is restricted to students transferring from UW-Richland after their sophomore year.

How

Before the April 1 deadline, complete and submit your application along with your essay. See the Apply/Pay/Register section of the UW-Richland website at richland.uwc.edu for details, an application blank, and a list of the many scholarships available.

Tips

IMPORTANT: To be considered for a scholarship, you must have on file at UW-Richland an application for admission and supporting documents (high school & college transcripts, ACT scores).

1. Take time with & give careful thought to your application.
2. Be neat & accurate. Type your application & essay.
3. Use correct spelling & sentence structure.
4. Don't be modest. Include all important facets of your academic, school & community life.
5. Clearly define & present well your objectives.
 - Why are you going to college?
 - What do you plan to do after college?
 - Why are you a good candidate?
6. Submit your application by the April 1 deadline.
